## THE CROPS ACT, 2013

(No. 16 of 2013)

**IN EXERCISE** of the powers conferred by section 40 of the Crops Act, 2013, the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Irrigation, in consultation with the Agriculture and Food Authority and the County Governments, makes the following Regulations—

### THE CROPS (PYRETHRUM) REGULATIONS, 2019

#### PART I-PRELIMINARY

- Citation.                   1. These Regulations may be cited as the Crops (Pyrethrum) Regulations, 2019.
- Interpretation.           2. In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires—
- No.16 of 2013.            “Act” means the Crops Act 2013;
- No. 13 of 2013.           “Authority” means the Agriculture and Food Authority established under section 3 of the Agriculture and Food Authority Act;
- “Cabinet Secretary” means the Cabinet Secretary for the time being responsible for matters relating to agriculture;
- “commercial nursery operator” means a person who propagates pyrethrum planting material for sale;
- “county government” shall have the meaning assigned to it under Article 176 of the Constitution;
- “dealer” means a person collecting, transporting, storing, buying pyrethrum flowers on behalf of a licensed processor;
- “Directorate” means a directorate of the authority established under section 11, of the Agriculture and Food Authority Act to deal with pyrethrum matters;
- “exporter” means a processor licensed by the Authority to export pyrethrum products;
- “export permit” means a permit issued by the Authority to export pyrethrum and products;
- “export or import consignment” means quantity declared by applicant;
- “grist” means ground pyrethrum dry flowers;
- “grower” means a person who cultivates pyrethrum for flowers;
- “importer” means a processor licensed by the Authority to import pyrethrum and pyrethrum products;
- “import permit” means a permit issued by the Authority to import pyrethrum and products;
- “inspector” means an officer nominated by the County Government and gazetted by the Authority as an inspector in accordance with section 27 of the Act;

“license” means a license issued to a processor or an exporter;

“processor” means a person issued with a license under these regulations to extract pyrethrins from pyrethrum flowers or products;

“person” includes an individual, a company, an association, cooperative society or a corporate body;

“pyrethrum” means the plant or part of the plant of *Chrysanthemum* spp or of any inter-specific hybrid involving this species or of any progeny of such hybrid;

“pyrethrum extract” means an active ingredient obtained or derived from pyrethrum flower by treatment or processing;

“pyrethrum product” means any product, extract or substance obtained or derived from pyrethrum by any treatment or processing, not including grist; and

“Seed merchant” means a person registered under regulation 9 of the Seeds and Plant Varieties (seeds) Regulation.

Purpose.

3. (1) The purpose of these Regulations is to guide the promotion, development and regulation of pyrethrum and pyrethrum products.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the sub-regulation (1), the purpose of these regulations is to provide for—

- (a) procedures and conditions for registration of growers and dealers;
- (b) issuance of certificate of registration to commercial nursery operators and dealers;
- (c) procedure and conditions for licensing of processors;
- (d) issuance of certificate of compliance to processors;
- (e) recommendation of agreement between processors and growers;
- (f) issuance of export and import permits;
- (g) promotion of best practices in production, transportation, storage and processing of pyrethrum; and
- (h) imposition and administration of levies;

## **PART II—REGISTRATION AND LICENSING**

Registration of a  
Commercial Nursery

4. (1) A person shall not establish or operate a commercial nursery in any area unless the person has a valid certificate

of registration from the respective County Government.

- (2) A commercial nursery operator shall apply for a certificate of registration from County Government where they intend to establish the nursery in form MPICD/1<sub>a</sub> as set out in the First Schedule.
- (3) The County Government shall issue an annual certificate of registration to successful a commercial nursery operator in MPICD/1<sub>b</sub> as set out in the First Schedule, upon payment of the fee set out in the third schedule.
- (4) Before issuing a certificate of registration to a commercial nursery, the County Government shall satisfy itself that the applicant has complied with the Act, these Regulations and any other relevant law.
- (5) A commercial nursery operator shall avail the certificate of registration to the Authority for verification whenever requested.
- (6) A commercial nursery operator shall submit biannual returns to the County Government and the Authority as set out in Form MPICD/1<sub>c</sub> not later than the tenth day of the first month after the end of the half.
- (7) A person who operates a commercial nursery as such without being registered in accordance with this regulation commits an offence and shall be liable upon conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both.
- (8) All pyrethrum nurseries shall comply with National, Regional and International standards applicable.

Registration of  
Pyrethrum grower.

- 5.** (1) A grower shall, apply for registration to a processor licensed under these Regulations in Form MPICD/1<sub>d</sub> as set out in the First Schedule for purposes of—
  - (a) Data capture and maintenance; and
  - (b) Provision of extension services.
- (2) Upon registration under sub-regulation (1) the processor shall issue a certificate of registration to the grower in Form MPICD/1<sub>e</sub> as set out in the First Schedule.
- (3) The processor shall share the information obtained in sub-

regulation (1) with the Authority and the respective County Government.

- (4) A grower shall not register with more than one processor in respect of the same parcel of land under which they have grown pyrethrum.
- (5) A grower shall sign a contract with the processor where they are registered to deliver flowers as set out in the Second Schedule.
- (6) A contracted grower shall only sell pyrethrum flowers to that processor.
- (7) The processor shall maintain a register for the purposes of this part and shall record the particulars supplied accordingly.
- (8) The register referred to in sub regulation (7) shall be *prima facie* proof that a person is a registered pyrethrum grower.
- (9) A processor shall avail the particulars of such registration to the Authority and the respective County Government in Form MPICD/1<sub>f</sub> as set out in the First Schedule.
- (10) Any change in the particulars supplied by the grower for purposes of registration in accordance with this regulation shall be notified to the processor, County Government and the Authority in writing by the grower.
- (11) Where the processor has reasonable cause to believe that a person whose particulars are so recorded has ceased to be a grower, it may, after giving that person and the Authority one month's notice in writing, remove the name of such person from the register and inform the County Government and the Authority.
- (12) A person who grows and carries on business as such without being registered in accordance with this regulation or knowingly gives false particulars, commits an offence and shall be liable, upon conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both.

Registration of a dealer

**6.** (1) A dealer shall apply for annual Certificate of registration or renewal to the Authority in Form MPICD/1<sub>g</sub>, as set out in the First Schedule.

(2) The Authority shall issue an annual certificate of registration to a dealer in Form MPICD/1<sub>h</sub>, as set out in the First Schedule, upon payment of a fee set out in the Third Schedule.

(3) Before issuing a Certificate of registration to a dealer, the Authority shall satisfy itself that the applicant has complied with the terms and conditions as set out in the application for certificate of registration.

(4) A dealer shall submit quarterly returns to the County Government and the Authority in Form MPICD/1<sub>i</sub> as set out in the First Schedule not later than the tenth day of the first month after the end of that quarter.

(5) (1) The Authority may revoke, alter or suspend a Certificate of registration issued under these Regulations if the certificate holder if

- a) Fails to comply with these Regulations or the conditions set out in the certificate of registration; or;
- b) Commits an offence under the Act, these Regulations or any other written law in respect of the activity for which they have been registered.

(2) A person who contravenes regulations 5 (1) shall be liable upon conviction to a fine not exceeding five million shillings and to a term not exceeding three years or to both.

Registration of a processor

**7.** A person who intends to process pyrethrum flowers or products shall apply to the Authority for a certificate of registration in Form MPICD/1<sub>j</sub>, as set out in the First Schedule

Letter of no Objection

**8.** (1) The Authority shall issue a letter of no objection to a new applicant in Form MPICD/1<sub>k</sub> set out in the First Schedule, upon satisfying itself that the applicant has complied with the requirements of regulation 7.

(2) The letter of no objection shall authorize the applicant to commence the project.

Revocation of letter of no Objection.

**9.** (1) The Authority may revoke a letter of no objection issued under regulation 8 if —

- (a) the applicant made material misrepresentation or a false declaration in the application or;

- (b) the letter of no objection was otherwise obtained by corruption or fraud; or
- (c) a condition of the letter of no objection has been breached and no remedial measures have been made; or
- (d) The applicant has contravened the provisions of the Crops Act or these Regulations.

Notification for Inspection

**10.** The applicant shall notify the Authority upon completion of construction of the processing factory and compliance with the conditions in the letter of no objection in Form MPICD/1<sub>l</sub> as set out in the First Schedule.

Issuance of registration certificate

**11.** (1) The Authority shall satisfy itself that the applicant has complied with the provisions of the Act and these Regulations before issuance of a certificate of registration.

(2) The Authority shall issue the certificate of registration to the applicant in Form MPICD/1<sub>m</sub> as set out in the First Schedule

Licensing of Processors.

**12.** (1) The holder of a Certificate of Registration shall apply to the County Government for an processing license on Form MPICD/1<sub>n</sub> set out in the First Schedule

(2) The County Government shall issue a processing License in Form MPICD/1<sub>p</sub> as set out in the First Schedule.

(3) The license issued under sub regulation (2) shall be renewed annually at a fee as set out in the Third Schedule.

(4) The County Government shall at least thirty days before granting a license under these Regulations, give notice of the proposed grant in the Kenya Gazette and in such other manner as the County Government may determine.

(5) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub regulation (4) the County Government may suspend or revoke a license issued under these Regulations.

Conformity Certificate

**13.** (1) A processor shall apply to the Authority for a certificate of conformity or renewal in Form MPICD/1<sub>q</sub> as set out in the first schedule, upon payment of prescribed fee in the



Fourth schedule

(2) The Authority shall issue an annual certificate of conformity as set out in form MPICD/1<sub>r</sub> of the First schedule.

(3) A processor who contravenes regulation 13 (1) and (2) commits an offence and shall be liable, upon conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both.

Contract between  
processors and  
growers.

**14. (1) A processor shall—**

- (a) enter into a contract with its registered growers and register the contract with the County Government and the Authority as set out in the Second Schedule;
- (b) indicate in the contract the price payable to the grower based on the pyrethrin content;
- (c) pay growers for flowers delivered within thirty days from the date of collection; and

(d) not buy pyrethrum flowers from any other person other than the growers contracted by the processor.

(2) Provided that a processor may enter into an agreement with another processor in the event a processor is unable to buy flowers from its contracted growers.

Returns.

**15.** (1) A processor shall submit quarterly returns to the County Government and the Authority as set out in Form MPICD/1<sub>s</sub> not later than the tenth day of the first month after the end of that quarter.

(2) A processor who contravenes regulation 8 and 11(1) commits an offence and shall be liable upon conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand shillings or to imprisonment of a term not exceeding six months or to both.

Plant breeders rights and Market access

**16.** (1) A licensed processor or a registered commercial nursery operator or a seed merchant shall access plant breeder's rights in accordance with the national, regional and international laws.

(2) A licensed processor shall access product registration data from the Authority upon payment of royalties as shall be determined by the Authority in collaboration with other relevant bodies from time to time

Licensing of exporters and importers.

**17.** (1) A licensed processor who intends to export or import pyrethrum or pyrethrum products, shall apply to the Authority for an export or import license or renewal in Form MPICD/1<sub>t</sub> as set out in the First Schedule.

(2) An importer shall pay license application or renewal fee as prescribed in the Third Schedule.

(3) The Authority shall issue an export or import license in Form MPICD/1<sub>u</sub> as set out in the First Schedule.

Revocation of licenses.

**18.** The County Government and the Authority may revoke or suspend the licenses if a processor, exporter or importer contravenes the provisions of the Act or any Regulations made there under.

Issuance of an Export/ Import Permit.

**19.** (1) A licensed processor shall apply to the Authority for an export or import permit for each consignment in Form MPICD/1<sub>v</sub> as set out in the First Schedule.

(2) The Authority shall issue an export or import permit to a

licensed processor in Form MPICD/1<sub>w</sub> as set out in the First Schedule upon verification of the customs documentation on pyrethrum export or import of any pyrethrum consignments.

(3) A processor shall not export or import pyrethrum or pyrethrum products without a valid license and permit issued by the Authority.

(4) Before issuing a license or a permit to an exporter or importer, the Authority shall satisfy itself that the applicant has complied with the Act, these Regulations and any other relevant law.

(5) The Authority shall not issue a permit if a processor is in contravention of the provisions of the Act or any regulations made thereunder.

(6) The Authority may revoke or suspend the export or import permit if a processor contravenes the provisions of the Act or any Regulations made there under.

Decision on  
Registration and  
Licensing

**20.** (1) Registration certificates and licenses issued under these Regulations shall remain in force until the thirtieth of June next following the date of issue unless earlier cancelled.

(2) There shall be payable for the issuance of licenses such fees as prescribed under the Third Schedule.

(3) An application for renewal of a registration and licensing under these Regulations shall be made to the Authority or County Government as the case maybe, not later than the first day of the month of June in which the current registration or license is due to expire.

(4) The Authority and County Government shall after considering an application for Certificate of registration and license make a decision within ninety days after receipt of a duly completed application.

Non- Transferability  
of license and  
certificates of  
registration.

**21.** A license or certificate of registration issued under these Regulations shall not be transferrable.

### **PART III STANDARDS FOR PYRETHRUM AND PYRETHRUM PRODUCTS**

**22.** (1) The processor shall appoint a qualified person to inspect all pyrethrum flowers received by the processor.

(2) The person appointed under sub-regulation (1) shall issue a goods received note showing a grower the net weight of the pyrethrum received.

(3) The analysis of pyrethrum flowers to determine the rate of payment shall be carried out by a person appointed by the processor.

(4) A person appointed under paragraph (3) shall determine the rate of payment in the following manner—

(a) a sample shall be extracted by a method approved by the Authority from each bag of pyrethrum delivered to the processor;

(b) every grower's sample shall be analysed by the method approved by the Authority to determine the pyrethrins content of each grower's deliveries;

(c) samples taken a month apart shall be analysed separately;

(d) samples received within the month shall be mixed, subdivided and analysed;

(e) each residual sample shall be registered and analysed, by the method in the regulations, in the processors' laboratories to determine the pyrethrins content of each grower's deliveries during the period; and

(f) each grower registered sample shall be analysed and results of the analysis after the completion of the analysis by the processors' laboratories communicated by statement to the grower not later than twenty-one days of registration of the sample.

(g) The statement in (f) shall indicate among others, the weight, pyrethrins content and the payment rate.

Appointment of inspectors.

**23.** (1) The County Government may nominate crop inspectors for appointment and gazettelement by the Authority to carry out inspections to check for conformity as set out in section 28 of the Crops Act.

(2) A person appointed as an inspector under sub regulation one shall—

(a) be a Kenyan citizen;

(b) meet the requirements of Chapter Six and Article 232 of the Constitution;

(c) meet the requirements of the Public Officer’s Ethics Act, 2003 and Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012; and

(d) hold a diploma in agriculture or agriculture related field from a recognized institution and a minimum of two years of relevant experience; or

(e) hold a Bachelors’ degree in agriculture or agriculture related field from a recognized institution.

Powers of Entry and inspection.

**24.** In exercise of their power of entry and inspection, the inspector shall be guided by the provisions of section 29 of the Act.

#### **PART IV—GENERAL PROVISIONS**

Modification of the forms.

**25.** The Authority or the County government, as the case may be may make such modifications, alterations and or additions, as may be required from time to time to enable effective use of prescribed forms, including use of such forms electronically.

Validity of licenses and certificates of registration.

**26.** All licenses and certificates of registration issued under these Regulations shall remain in force until the thirtieth of June next following the date of issue, unless earlier cancelled.

Transition provisions.

**27.** All licenses existing before the coming into registration of these Regulations shall remain valid until their expiry, and subsequent licenses shall be issued under these Regulations.

Dispute resolution  
Committee.

**28.** (1) There shall be a committee to mediate disputes arising between growers, dealers and processors.

(2) The Committee shall comprise of—

(a) one person representing the Ministry for the time being responsible for matters related to agriculture;

(b) two persons representing the Authority;

(c) Two County Executive Committee Members for Agriculture nominated by the Council of Governors

(d) Four growers representatives; and

(e) two people nominated by the Authority in writing from the private sector who in their opinion possess knowledge and experience likely to be beneficial to the committee.

(3) The committee members shall in their first meeting called by the Authority elect the officials and agree on the procedures of conducting their meetings.

Pricing formula  
committee.

**29.** (1) There shall be a pyrethrum pricing formula committee (Herein after referred to as “the Committee”) to determine the formula of pyrethrum flowers comprising of —

(a) one representative from the ministry for the time being responsible for matters related to agriculture;

(b) three representative from the Authority;

(c) two County Executive Committee Members for Agriculture nominated by the Council of Government

(d) two growers representatives

(e) two representative from the processors; and

(f) one representative from the ministry for the time being responsible for matters related to finance

(2) The committee members shall, in their first meeting called by the Authority, elect the officials and agree on the procedures of conducting their meetings

(3) Data presented at the Committee meetings shall be verified by the Authority or other certified professional or their bodies.

Pyrethrum Levy

**30.** (1) The Cabinet Secretary may impose a pyrethrum levy payable at the rate of one per centum of the value of the ex-factory pyrethrum products.

(2) The proceeds of the levy shall be apportioned as follows—

(i) fifty per centum shall be used for research and development of pyrethrum, technologies, varieties and maintain the breeder's and innovators' rights;

(ii) fifty per centum shall be used for market research, market registration and market maintenance for pyrethrum and pyrethrum products.

General penalty.

**31.** (1) A person who commits an offence under these regulations for which no penalty is provided for, shall be liable, upon conviction, to the penalty provided under section 37 of the Act.

  - e. Deliver the pyrethrum flowers within 30days of harvesting to a collection Centre within the growing area – to be agreed with the company

  - a) Appoint a qualified person to offer extension services to the grower on all aspects of pyrethrum production including;
    - providing a grower’s manual outlining commonly used pyrethrum production practices.

- To query the pyrethrin quality assessment made by the company within ten days after the receipt of the companies' quality report

2) In the event that the grower queries the company's pyrethrin quality assessment;

- The retention sample will be submitted to an independent laboratory appointed by the Agriculture and Food Authority for confirmation of pyrethrin content
- The findings of the independent laboratory will be binding on both parties.
- The cost of confirmation by the independent laboratory will be borne by the party whose assessment has the greatest deviation from the findings of the independent laboratory.

If the grower does not query the quality report in writing within ten days of receipt of the company's quality report, the report will be deemed to have been accepted by the grower.

### **Annex 1**

#### **Pyrethrum flower quality specification and packaging requirements**

1. The pyrethrum flower must comply with the quality standards stated in process's description
2. The flowers must be clean, composed of only whole flowers and flowers components (predominantly archeries) with no extraneous matter.
3. The flowers must be:
  - Dry with a characteristics aroma,
  - Free from rancid odor, mold or mustiness,
  - Free from foreign matter (twigs, weeds)
  - Free from pests and insects infestation, mites, insect fragments, excrement or other animal contamination,
  - Free from adulteration (chaff, sand, gravel, paper, cloth, wood, plastic etc.)
4. The pyrethrin content of the flowers must be at least 1.0% (measured by AOAC official)
5. The flowers delivered to the processor .....must have a moisture content below 10%
  - Flowers accepted by the processor with higher moisture content will be dried by the processor the farmer's cost and the weight adjusted pro rata to 10% moisture content
  - Flowers with moisture content above 12% will be rejected.
6. The flowers must be packed in clean and dry sisal bags dedicated to pyrethrum flowers with 30 kg in each bag.
  - Initially the company will accept packaging in clean polypropylene bags; however the intention is after one growing season to move to sisal bags.
  - The use of any bags that have been used for any other material is strictly not permitted.
7. To ensure traceability of the flowers, all bags must be well labelled with the grower's name, farm location, net weight and where applicable the delivery note number.
8. The flower must be delivered to the area collection center within 30 days from the date of picking.
